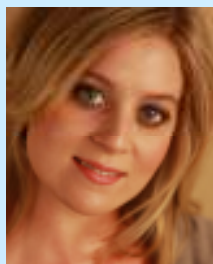

Julie Goodwin



Julie has recently completed a two year Australasian tour of *The Phantom of The Opera*, appearing in over 200 performances in the role of Christine Daae.

In 2007 Julie led the National Anthem for the opening ceremony of the Australian Youth Olympics Festival and the Australia Day Spectacular, Darling Harbour. In 2006 she was a soloist for The Royal Flying Doctor Service concert (City Recital Hall, Angel Place) performing alongside many of Australia's most distinguished performers. She has been a featured soloist in both the 2005 and 2006 Schools Spectacular performances, live and on the ABC. Julie graduated in 2005 from the Sydney Conservatorium High School, was selected to perform in *Encore* at the Sydney Opera House and was awarded a merit scholarship to the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, where she has been studying with Dr Rowena Cowley. Julie is also a graduate of the prestigious Talent Development Project

(2006). Julie has toured Singapore with the Queensland Symphonic Winds and in 2002 was privileged to sing for HRH Duke of Edinburgh and Commonwealth leaders during CHOGM. Further accolades for this fine young performer include the 4MBS Classic FM Outstanding Student Award (2003), an Australian Young Citizen Award (Beaudesert, QLD, 2002), and two scholarships from the Youth and Tourism Foundation for Young Australians (2006/07).

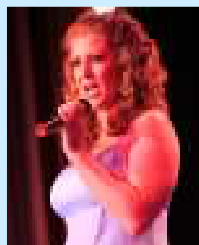
Robert McDougall



Robert began his musical career at the Tamworth Regional Conservatorium of Music. While at school, he featured in The NSW Schools Spectacular, and graduated from the prestigious NSW Talent Development Project in 2007. He was awarded a scholarship from the Sport and Tourism Youth Foundation. Since then, Robert's performance credits include Frederick in *Pirates of Penzance* (Sydney University Musical Ensemble), Marius in *Les Miserables* (NIDA's Parade Theatre) and performances at major events such as the World Youth Olympics, The Anzac Military Tattoo, NSW Sports Federation Awards and the Victor Chang Happy Heart Ball. He was also a support act for Michael Buble at Sydney Entertainment Centre. He is currently a featured vocalist with Newcastle Big Band "Ultra Swing Lounge".

In conjunction with Rotary International, Robert has produced two fundraising concerts in the Tamworth area, and recorded two CDs with proceeds going to Australian Rotary Health Research into youth depression in young musicians. Rotary have acknowledged Robert as a Diamond Friend of the fund and have awarded him a Paul Harris Fellowship. Robert is currently studying at The Sydney Conservatorium of Music and Sydney University doing a double degree - Bachelor of Music Studies (Voice). and Bachelor of Arts.

Jodie Goodwin



Jodie is sixteen and attends the Sydney Conservatorium High School, studying voice with Dr Rowena Cowley. She received honours in her 5th grade AMEB singing exam and is currently studying for her grade six.

Jodie has been a member of the Bankstown Talent Advancement Program since 2006 and she recently travelled to Japan with this group, performing in Osaka and in Tokyo Disney. She is also a junior member of the NSW Department of Education, Talent Development Project. In both 2008 and again this year Jodie is a Featured Artist in the NSW Schools Spectacular held at the Sydney Entertainment Centre.

Jodie has also enjoyed performing the National Anthem at Australia Day ceremonies and at the World Masters and World Cycling Championships in 2009.
